## **Welcome to our Palm Sunday worship here at St. Paul's!**

We hope that you feel at home with us as we gather to worship our holy and merciful God, as well as to strengthen our faith through His Means of Grace, God's Word and sacraments. We pray that today's worship service be a blessing to you, and strengthens your faith in our one and only Savior from sin!

### **What do we believe and teach?**

In a very brief thumb-nail sketch, we are committed to holy Scriptures in their entirety, and do not believe we have the right or authority to pick and choose what we do or don't want to believe from it. We believe that ALL the Bible is God's very Word to all of mankind which points to the only way to eternal salvation in heaven, namely through faith in Jesus. We believe that since it is God's Word, in its original form, that it has no errors and is completely factual. We believe in the triune God - God the Father who makes and preserves us; God the Son, who redeemed us with His holy blood; and God the Holy Spirit, who converts and strengthens our saving faith.

**ALL: We say that we'll follow You wherever you go, but too often we do not. Instead, like Peter, too often we deny knowing You. Too often we try to fit in with the crowd. Too often we avoid risking ourselves for Your sake and for the sake of the gospel.**

**ALL: Forgive us Lord for our sinful parts in nailing You to the cross to suffer and die.**

God gives each of us His personal promise - *"Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool."* We have nothing to fear, since Jesus has redeemed us. Our sins are forgiven through His sacrifice and death! Let us now live our lives in keeping with that repentance. Let us pray.

**ALL: We praise You, O God, for the great acts of love by which You have redeemed us through Your Son, Jesus Christ. As He was adored by those who scattered their garments and branches of palms in His path, so may we always hail Him as our King and follow Him with perfect confidence; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.**

*The prophet Zechariah foretells the coming of Zion's King to his city in humility and lowliness. He enters "righteous and having salvation." The King's procession is unlike that of any earthly monarch because he brings peace between God and man.*

<sup>9</sup> Rejoice greatly, O Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and having salvation, gentle and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

<sup>10</sup> I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the war-horses from Jerusalem, and the battle bow will be broken. He will proclaim peace to the nations. His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth.

**SCRIPTURE LESSON** Philippians 2:3-11

*Paul encourages the Philippians, and all Christians, to imitate Christ. Paul describes the Christ who humbled himself to death on the cross and was exalted to the highest place in the heavens.*

<sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup> Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others.

<sup>5</sup> Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus:

<sup>6</sup> Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, <sup>7</sup> but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. <sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross! <sup>9</sup> Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup> that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup> and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

**CONFESSION OF OUR CHRISTIAN FAITH**

We believe that Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God, one with the Father from all eternity. In the course of time, He took a complete, yet sinless, human nature to himself when He was conceived as a holy child in the virgin Mary through a miracle of the Holy Spirit. God's angel testified, "*What is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit*". Jesus Christ is unique, for in Him the true God and a true human nature are inseparably united in one person, the holy God-man.

We believe that Jesus at all times possessed the fullness of the Deity with all divine power, wisdom, and glory. His divinity was evident when He performed miracles. But while He lived on earth, He took on the form of a servant, humbling himself by laying aside the continuous and full display and use of His divine characteristics. During this time He lived as a man among mankind, endured suffering, and humbled himself to the shameful death on the cross.

We believe that Jesus descended into hell to proclaim His victory over Satan. We believe that He rose again from the grave with a glorified body, ascended into heaven, and is exalted to rule with power over the world, to rule with grace in His church, and to rule with glory for eternity.

We believe that Jesus did all this for our salvation, and because of this, we give our thanks and praise to God!



## Good Outcome for a Court Case in Finland

Religious freedom and the ability to proclaim the teachings of Scripture without fear of government persecution is something we in the United States have taken for granted. But there are increasing examples from around the world where even seemingly free and democratic countries are attempting to restrict the abilities of Christians to express their faith and their teachings openly.

In Finland, a member of Parliament and former Minister of the Interior, Paivi Rasanen, was charged with “hate speech” for sharing her faith-based views dealing with marriage and sexual ethics in her writings and in media interviews. A Lutheran bishop, Juhana Pohjola, was also charged because he published some of Rasanen’s writings.

When charges were brought, confessional Lutheran churches from around the world signed a letter to the prosecutors in Finland that strongly urged the court to uphold the principle of freedom of religion and free speech and to dismiss the charges against Rasanen and Pohjola. The Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod and our sister churches in Europe signed the letter, along with the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod and its partner churches.

Last week, the Finnish court upheld the right to free speech by dismissing all charges against Paivi Rasanen and Bishop Pohjola.

We are happy that the courts of Finland made this decision. But this entire episode is a reminder that the freedom we enjoy to proclaim the truths of Scripture can never be taken for granted. We pray that God would preserve this freedom for us here in America and give us the courage to “speak about the things that we have seen and heard.”
