

TODAY'S WORSHIP FOCUS

The last weeks of the church year focus on the end-times, Judgment Day. There certainly is the picture of destruction and gloom and doom. But the Christian has the very positive reminder of loved ones already being saints in heaven, as well as living Christians also being forgiven saints through the gift of faith!

INVOCATION

P: We join in worship today with all the saints who have entered the Church Triumphant in heaven.

C: As they worship in the splendor of God's heaven, we worship as the Church Militant here on earth in presence of His glory.

P: We are glad to be in God's house, and to celebrate His majesty and mercy.

C: Let us worship our Lord, who is the same yesterday, today and forever!

CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS

Based on Psalm 32.

P: We have truly been blessed in countless ways in our lives by our loving God. We have freedom of religion instead of living under religious tyranny as much of the world does. God has given us family and friends to help us in both comfortable and challenging times throughout our lives.

C: Our lives overflow with material blessings as our heavenly Father gives us what we need to live, and the Holy Spirit strengthens us in our faith through his Word and Sacraments.

P: Every day we show that we are both saints and sinners, saints, forgiven through Jesus' blood, and sinners, who daily disobey God and deserve nothing but eternal death for those sins. Therefore, let us confess our sins to our almighty and merciful God using the words of Psalm 32, and plead for His mercy.

C: "When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long."

P: "For day and night your hand was heavy upon me;

C: "My strength was sapped as in the heat of summer."

P: "Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity."

C: I have sinned against you, O Lord, in countless ways, and "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord."

P: The Lord has heard our confession coming from a repentant heart. Based on the perfect life and innocent death of His Son as our substitute, He has forgiven the guilt of all our sins. We now leave our lives of sin and praise the Lord in all we do!

C: "Blessed is he whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered."

P: "Blessed is the man whose sin the LORD does not count against him, and in whose spirit is no deceit.

C: "Rejoice in the Lord and be glad, you righteous; sing, all you who are upright in heart!"

P: ² Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. ³ Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort,

C: ⁴ who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.

P: Dear friends, may the Lord and all His blessings be with you.

C: Pastor, may He also bless and be with you.

SAINTS-TRIUMPHANT DIALOGUE

The resurrection to “eternal life” doesn’t only refer to heaven!

P: According to the Bible, what happens when a person dies?

ALL: The person’s soul is separated the body. “The dust returns to the ground it came from, and the spirit returns to God who gave it.” Ecclesiastes chapter twelve, verse seven.

P: What does the Bible say will happen in the resurrection of the Last Day, Judgment Day?

ALL: On the Last Day, Judgment Day, God will use His power to raise from the dead, the bodies of all people who have died throughout history. “A time is coming when all who are in their graves will hear his voice and come out.” John chapter five, verse twenty-eight.

P: What does the Bible say will happen to the unbelievers who don’t know or have rejected God’s gracious invitation of forgiveness through Jesus?

ALL: Sadly, they will be separated from God to live in eternal torment in a place called hell. “Then [Jesus] will say to those on his left, ‘Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels.’” Matthew chapter twenty-five, verse forty-one.

P: What does the Bible say will happen to those who, through the gift of faith, trust in Jesus for the forgiveness of their sins?

ALL: The Bible says, “We will be with the Lord forever!” First Thessalonians chapter four, verse seventeen. “Then the King will say to those on his right, ‘Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.’” Matthew chapter twenty-five, verse thirty-four.

Despised and scorned, they sojourned here;
But now, how glorious they appear!

P: What does the Bible say my life in heaven will be like?

ALL: When I am with God in heaven, I will be free from all pain, sadness, and troubles of this life on earth!

P: Revelation chapter seven, verses sixteen and seventeen refer to the saints in heaven... ¹⁶ Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat upon them, nor any scorching heat.

ALL: ¹⁷ For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; he will lead them to springs of living water. And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes."

P: What does the Bible say will happen to my body on Judgment Day?

ALL: Jesus will change my imperfect, sinful body into a holy replica of His glorious body so that it lives forever in heaven with Him! “[Christ] will transform our lowly bodies so that they will be like his glorious body.” Philippians chapter three, verse twenty-one.

P: How does this affect me?

ALL: When I think of a loved one who has died in Jesus, it makes me glad to know all this is true for them! When I think of my own death, I look forward to that day with thankful anticipation! “Our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.” Philippians chapter three, verse twenty.

O blessed saints, now take your rest;

OUR END-TIME CONFESSION OF FAITH

P: God has set a day when He will judge the world with holy justice by His Son whom He has appointed.

C: He has given proof of this to all people by raising Jesus from the dead.

P: The Lord Jesus himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command,

C: with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God.

P: When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, He will sit on His throne in heavenly glory.

C: All the nations will be gathered before Him.

P: There will be a resurrection of all people from all time, both those forgiven through faith, and those who are not forgiven. Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake:

C: some to everlasting peace and joy, others to shame and everlasting suffering.

P: Whoever believes in Jesus will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already

C: because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son.

P: The King will say to us, “Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance,

C: the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world.”

P: Christ will transform our lowly bodies

C: so that they will be like His glorious body.

P: Then those without saving faith will go away to eternal punishment, and those who are blessed with faith will go to eternal peace and joy in heaven.

C: And so we will be with the Lord forever.

P: Our citizenship is in heaven.

C: And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.

P: Therefore we keep watch, because we do not know on what day our Lord will come.

ALL: We must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at a time when we do not expect him. Come quickly, Lord Jesus! Come quickly to take us to be with You!

A SCRIPTURE LESSON II Corinthians 5:1-10

As living saints, we look forward to reaching our final, permanent home in heaven with all the other saints who are already there!

¹ Now we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. ² Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, ³ because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. ⁴ For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life. ⁵ Now it is God who has made us for this very purpose and has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come.

⁶ Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. ⁷ We live by faith, not by sight. ⁸ We are confident, I say, and would prefer to be away from the body and at home with the Lord. ⁹ So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. ¹⁰ For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad.
