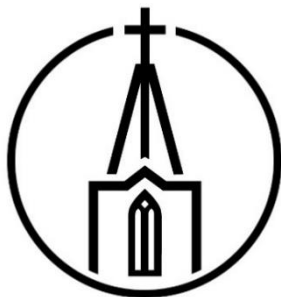

Welcome to all guests and visitors with us this morning!

*Many of you may be here attending this confirmation service as a grandparent or maybe an uncle or aunt, or maybe as a friend! While this Lutheran rite is taking place this morning, we also are gathered for the expressed purpose of **worshipping our God** who showed His love for all people by sending His Son to die for our sins on the cross of Calvary. We're also gathered to **strengthen our faith** through hearing His Word.*

If you have any questions about the teachings of St. Paul's, which is part of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, please contact Pastor Hirsch, whose number is on the last page. We invite our guests to come again and worship with us again. You are always welcome here in God's house!

This morning the sacrament of Holy Communion will be served to those confirmed members of our congregation here at St. Paul's and to those who are members of sister congregations in the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. The religious world around us encourages any and all people to come before the Lord's altar and receive holy communion, but as we study Scripture we see that there are limitations on who should receive this sacrament. This truth is not meant to portray a "better than thou" attitude on the part of any Christian, but simply holds to the instruction found in Scripture! A person needs to be able to "examine" and "prepare" himself by confessing his sins, trusting in the forgiveness won by Jesus Christ (I Corinthians 11:27-29), and then also realize that the very body and blood of Jesus are present in the sacrament!

We also read in Romans 16:17 to "keep away" from those who teach and believe contrary to what Scripture teaches. We are in fact confessing that whoever receives the Lord's Supper together, believes exactly the same thing about all Bible doctrines (I Corinthians 10:17). The fact is, that whoever receives the Lord's body and blood in an "unworthy manner," in unbelief or doubt, receives the Lord's judgment (I Corinthians 11:27-29). Therefore, in a humble yet loving and concerned way, we offer it to those who have been instructed and believe that they receive forgiveness as they receive the bread and wine, along with Jesus' body and blood.

"This is my body...this is my blood."

In this service today, five young Christians will be confirming their saving faith in and their life-long faithfulness to their Lord and Savior. Please keep the following in your prayers!!

PASTOR'S WELCOME

P: On behalf of our risen Savior, Jesus Christ, I welcome you all to God's house. But why have you come?

C: We share the attitude of the Psalm writer when he said - “I rejoice with those who said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the Lord.’ We have come with joy, to rejoice that Jesus is our Savior.

P: How good it is to rejoice in the name of our Lord! Let's begin our confirmation worship service by lifting up our hearts and our voices in praise to our triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

WE CONFESS OUR SINS

P: In Psalm 24, we clearly see that the only person who may ascend the hill of the Lord and stand in His presence for eternity in heaven is the one who has clean hands and a pure heart. This means we are to be completely holy in our actions and our thoughts in order to reach heaven.

ALL: But each one of us has received a sinful nature from our sinful parents, and we do have unclean lips and impure hearts. We do break God's law everyday by our thoughts, words and actions.

P: Therefore, why else have we come to God's house?

ALL: God says, "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." We have come this morning to confess our sins, and to ask for His forgiveness.

P: It is good that we do not try to hide or make excuses for our sins, because God sees and knows everything, including ALL our thoughts and actions. Rather, let us confess all our sins and lay them all before the cross of Christ so that through His mercy we might hear His clear and certain words of forgiveness.

ALL: Dear God of all mercy, I come before Your holy throne this morning, seeking Your forgiveness for my rebellion against Your commands. Through the gift of faith, I have strength to follow Your commands, but often times I put myself and my concerns first in my life instead of making You my first priority. I have not loved those around me as much as I love myself. I have been mean, lustful, arrogant, greedy and selfish. Forgive me for my worldliness and my lack of godliness. Forgive me for all the times I was lazy and refused to listen to Your Word, trust in Your power, and obey Your commands. In Your mercy, please forgive all my sins.

P: The Lord has assured us - "As surely as I live, I take no pleasure in the death of the wicked, but rather that they turn from their ways and live." In fact, "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life." Therefore, on behalf and by the command of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, I forgive you of all your sins, and declare you to be clean of your guilt, in the name of the almighty God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

WE PUBLICLY CONFESS OUR FAITH

P: God has written, “If you confess with your mouth, “Jesus is Lord” and believe in your hearts that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.” Therefore, why else have we come this morning?

ALL: We have also come to join with these confirmands to confess the Christian faith in the triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

WE CONFESS THIS CHRISTIAN FAITH!

I believe the Bible teaches us that there is one God, yet that one God is also three distinct persons who all work together for the salvation of my soul.

I believe in God the Father almighty, who made the universe and all it contains, and sustains it with His mighty power. He gave me my life so that I may learn about my Savior Jesus and be saved for eternity.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His one and only Son, who reconciled lost mankind to the Father through His perfect life, sacrificial death, and glorious resurrection.

I believe in God the Holy Spirit, who gathers and strengthens sinners into God's forgiven family which we call the Church. He creates saving faith in a person's heart through the faithful use of the Gospel in Word and Sacrament.

Even though I do not understand how three persons are still one God, through faith I believe this gracious truth, and I thank and praise this gracious triune God!

Open our hearts now, and in the future, as we joyfully give back to You in love. Hear us to the glory of Your name. Amen!

THE RITE OF CONFIRMATION

COMMITMENTS OF CONFIRMANDS' FAMILIES

Pastor, to the confirmands' families, their parents. Would you please stand!

When you brought your children to be baptized, you realized that you were following the will of the Lord Jesus who said - "Let the little children come to me." At that time you understood that your spiritual responsibilities had not ended at their baptisms. You knew that the Scriptures also commanded you to "bring up your children in the training and instruction of the Lord." You have done this in your home, and by using the assistance that has been offered by your fellow Christians in this congregation.

However, the Lord Jesus wants you to remember that your Christian parental duties to your children are not completed at their confirmations either. Your responsibilities as parents and family continue until they are ended by death!

Therefore, I ask you: will you not only continue, but also improve your efforts to lead your children to appreciate the Word of God, to encourage them to attend the Lord's Supper often, as well as encouraging them to make daily use of God's Word at home? Will you carry out these duties faithfully and firmly, remembering their importance, but also with love and understanding, realizing that these young men and women are passing from childhood into maturity? Will you, by your words and examples, impress upon them the necessity of hearing the Word of the Lord, which is the one thing needful for salvation? Will you in every way, continue to point your children to their Lord Jesus Christ, who has promised them, and you, a crown of righteousness in heaven? If so, answer - "We will, and we ask God to help us."

Pastor, to the confirmands' spiritual family, St. Paul's congregation.

Would you please stand!

Brothers and sisters in Christ: Our Lord commands that we teach His precious truths to all people, which of course includes these confirmands. Christian love therefore urges all of us, including congregation members, to assist in whatever manner possible so that they may remain children of God until death. If you are willing to carry out this responsibility through your prayers, offerings, and encouragement, then answer: "We will, and we ask God to help us."

OUR PRAYERS & LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.

THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

P: What is the sacrament of Holy Communion?

ALL: It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ together with the bread and wine, instituted by Christ for us Christians to eat and to drink.

P: What blessings do we receive through this eating and drinking?

ALL: That is shown us by these words, "Given and poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins." Through these words we receive forgiveness of sins, life and salvation in this sacrament. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.

P: How can eating and drinking do such great things?

ALL: It is certainly not the eating and drinking that does such things, but the words, "Given and poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins." These words are the main thing in this sacrament, along with the eating and drinking. And whoever believes these words has what they plainly say, the forgiveness of sins.

P: Who, then, is properly prepared to receive this sacrament?

ALL: Fasting and other outward preparations may serve a good purpose, but he is properly prepared who believes these words, "Given and poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins." But whoever does not believe these words or doubts them is not prepared, because the words "for you" require nothing but hearts that believe.

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying,

C: "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."



P: Then Jesus took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying,

C: “Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

ALL: May the peace of the Lord’s grace and mercy always be with us!

DISTRIBUTION

This morning, the five members of the Confirmation class will receive the Lord’s Supper as a class, then for the remaining distribution, please follow the direction of the usher to file forward single file. If you’re sitting together as a family unit or couple in the pew, come forward in that single file, but feel free to join together as that same family unit or couple to receive the bread and then the wine together.

Again, as is stated before on p. 2 of this folder, for Scriptural reasons, we humbly ask that confirmed members of the Wisconsin Synod come forward for the sacrament.

Update from Ukraine: April 20, 2022

Rev. Roger Neumann serves as the WELS liaison to Ukraine. He has been able to maintain regular contact with the leadership from the Ukrainian Lutheran Church (ULC) and is providing regular updates about how our brothers and sisters in the ULC are doing. WELS has decided to share Neumann's updates. Please keep the people of Ukraine in your prayers.

April 17:

Bishop Horpynchuk traveled back to Kiev to lead Palm Sunday worship service today. He assured me that he was safe and where they spent the night was in a safe location. Bishop said that the congregation was very happy to see him, and to be with one another. And they were happy to see each other alive. He also told me that the congregation expressed great thanks to the WELS and many others who are supporting them with their prayers and gifts.

Pastor Serhiy Somin traveled back to Mykolayiv to lead Easter worship with the German congregation he serves. Pastor Somin led the service today in the basement. I suspect they worshiped in the basement, being cautious because of the constant threat of bombings. After their service they had a good German pot luck meal.

April 18:

Today I asked Bishop to tell me about his trip back to Kiev to lead the Palm Sunday worship at his congregation, this past weekend. He said that the trip took twice as long to drive due to the many checkpoints, and detours that were necessary because of road and bridge damage. One bridge he had to use was damaged, but usable, though it was at a fairly steep angle. He made the comment, "I almost slipped into the river." Most of the major bridges in Kiev are damaged or completely destroyed. He did arrive safely in Kiev and has returned safely. God be praised. Depending upon the intensity of the bombing, he will determine later this week whether or not he will return for Easter worship next Sunday.

April 19:

From Bishop Horpynchuk this morning: "Today I participated in the Ukrainian Church Council with the UN General Secretary Deputy, Mr. Martin Griffith and UN representative in Ukraine, Mr. Esteban Sacco on the request of the UN General Secretary. They asked to support an idea about Easter truce in Ukraine. We certainly supported the idea. Whether Russians agree is a question."

April 20:

Please keep Pastor Serhiy Somin in your prayers. He went back to have Easter service with his congregation in Mykolayiv. Bombing has intensified there in the days since and some of his people have asked if he would drive them to a safer location in the west. He will be going back into a dangerous area, picking them up and driving them out, We pray that all goes well and that the Lord keeps them safe.
