


St. Paul's is a member of the WELS...the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod. Just what is that?!?!

Wisconsin – In 1849, a group of Christians first joined together for like-minded Gospel ministry in the Milwaukee, Wisconsin area. Today, although our name only says “Wisconsin,” WELS congregations exist in all fifty states and in more than 25 countries.

Evangelical – This word simply means “good news.” The “Good News” of God’s love through Jesus is the heart of our faith and teaching.

Lutheran – In 16th century Europe, the church had strayed away from the Scriptures, and was teaching that a person is saved by his/her good works. A man named Martin Luther worked to return to the basic Biblical truths that a person is saved by grace alone, through faith alone, which comes by Scripture alone. Our congregation continues to build on these three Biblical truths.

Synod – This word means “walking together.” For over 150 years, St. Paul’s has been blessed as part of a church body, a synod, which consists of over 1,200 congregations, “walking together” in the same faith and the same ministry of sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

So often I have been selfish and insensitive to the needs of others. So often I have been lazy with my responsibility and privilege to grow in Your Word. So often I have loved myself more than You. P: Our heavenly Father does hear and accept our humble confession, and has been merciful to us. He has sent His Son to redeem us from our sins. The Second Scripture Lesson Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

Faith grips on to that which we do not see, and that faith raises our sights above this sinful life to life eternal in heaven as our true home.

¹ Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. ² This is what the ancients were commended for.

³ By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

⁸ By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. ⁹ By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰ For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹ And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she considered him faithful who had made the promise. ¹² And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore.

¹³ All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth. ¹⁴ People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

We Declare Our Christian Faith

I believe the Bible teaches us that there is one God, yet that one God is also three distinct persons who all work together for the salvation of my soul.

I believe in God the Father almighty, who made the universe and all it contains, and sustains it with His mighty power. He gave me my life so that I may learn about my Savior Jesus and be saved for eternity.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His one and only Son, who reconciled lost mankind to the Father through His perfect life, sacrificial death, and glorious resurrection.

I believe in God the Holy Spirit, who gathers and strengthens sinners into God's forgiven family which we call the Church. He creates saving faith in a person's heart through the faithful use of the Gospel in Word and Sacrament.

Even though I do not understand how three persons are still one God, through faith I believe this gracious truth, and I thank and praise this gracious triune God!



For lack of a better title, the name of the continuing campaign leadership committee is the “**Moving Forward Committee.**” This group has met twice, initially on July 25 and just this last week Monday, August 22. The plan is to have regular financial updates as well as plans and direction from this **Moving Forward Committee.** This is the first summary of these meetings. The next meeting is scheduled for September 19.

- 1) The committee is made up of Jim Herbolsheimer, Rick Meysenberg, John Uecker, Scott Uecker, Kristen Paul (who is continuing as our campaign assistant), Principal Aaron Markgraf and Pastor Paul Hirsch.
- 2) This committee is trying to meet bi-weekly.
- 3) Communication is ongoing with BC Builders and their architect.
- 4) Plans are being made to contact alumni from our school for their support.
- 5) Plans are being made to contact local corporations and businesses for their support.
- 6) Working on a system to recognize the generosity of so many members as well as non-member and businesses.
- 7) Working on a continuing social media/PR presence.
- 8) Looking to open a separate bank account for holding and distributing campaign funds.
